



## SCIENCE BOWL FAQ

! The Science Bowl is a one-day, round robin tournament followed by a double elimination competition focused specifically on math and science.

- ! The competition is open to teams of senior high school students throughout Ohio, Indiana, and Kentucky. Each team will be composed of four students, grades nine through twelve, one alternate student, and one faculty advisor. Team members must be from the same school.
- ! The competition will be held on **February 6, 2010** at Cincinnati State Technical and Community College. The website for Cincinnati State is <http://www.cincinnatiastate.edu> and the Greater Cincinnati Regional Science bowl information can be found at <http://www.emcbc.doe.gov/sciencebowl>
- ! The competition will be limited to the **first 24 teams** that respond. Teams will be enrolled based on the order in which their applications are received. Schools may submit two teams, the first choice "A" and the second choice "B". If 24 high schools do not respond, then the "B" teams will be used, again based on the date of entry.
- ! Registration will begin at 8:00 a.m.; finals will be over by 5:00 p.m. Because of the elimination process, the majority of the schools will be done by 2:00 p.m. Teams are encouraged to stay and observe the finals. There will also be a lunchtime presentation.
- ! Parents, guardians and cheering sections are welcome.
- ! Lunch will be provided only to students and their advisors. Parents, guardians, and others will be responsible for their own lunches.
- ! Students and faculty advisors will receive mementos of the competition. Additional prizes will be awarded to the top four teams.
- ! Questions include the fields of Astronomy, Biology, Chemistry, Earth Science, Physics, Algebra, Geometry, Trigonometry, Calculus, and General and Applied Sciences.
