DELEGATION ORDER

TO THE REGIONAL COUNSELS, REGIONAL OFFICES;
CHIEF COUNSELS, OPERATIONS OFFICES;
GENERAL COUNSELS, POWER MARKETING ADMINISTRATIONS OFFICES;
COUNSEL IN CHARGE, STRATEGIC PETROLEUM RESERVE OFFICE

Pursuant to the authority vested in me as General Counsel by Section 1014.5 of Title 10 Code of Federal Regulations, there is hereby delegated to the Regional Counsels, Regional Offices; Chief Counsels, Operations Offices; General Counsels, Power Marketing Administrations Offices; and the Counsel in Charge, Strategic Petroleum Reserve Office, on a nonexclusive basis, the authority to:

Receive, process, adjust, compromise, and settle tort claims presented to the Department of Energy (DOE), as provided under 10 C.F.R. 1014, as a result of any incident arising from the functions of the installation or office for which the designee is the legal representative or provides legal support.

The authority delegated to the above designated officials by this Order may be redelegated, in whole or part, as may be appropriate, except that the authority to adjust, determine, compromise, and settle tort claims may be delegated only to

the principal deputies of the above designated officials.

In exercising the authority delegated by this Order or as redelegated pursuant thereto, the delegate (s) shall be governed by the rules and regulations of DOE and the policies and procedures prescribed by the General Counsel or the General Counsel's delegates.

All actions pursuant to any authority delegated prior to this Order or pursuant to any authority delegated by this Order taken prior to and in effect on the date of this Order are hereby confirmed and ratified, and shall remain in full force and effect as if taken under this Order, unless or until rescinded, amended or superseded.

Nothing in this Order shall preclude the General Counsel from exercising any of the authority so delegated whenever in his judgment his exercise of such authority is necessary or appropriate to administer the functions vested in the General Counsel.

This Order is effective March 1, 1980.
